This hospital provides post-acute inpatient, and outpatient short-term and long-term specialized care for children and young adults with brain injuries, physical and/or cognitive disabilities or chronic medical problems.

There is a specialized brain injury program for children from adolescents up to age 21. The program includes, but may not be limited to, rehabilitation, day hospital, and outpatient programs. The treatment process involves an interdisciplinary team of professionals, family members and community liaisons.

There may be low-cost lodging available for family members who reside outside of the Albuquerque area. In addition, the hospital has many clinics and telehealth services throughout the state that can continue working with children on an outpatient basis upon their return home. Court involvement:

- Guardianship: for medical, educational, and financial care
  - Most supportive and restrictive; judge determines need
- Conservatorship: for financial

No court involvement/ lawyer prepares documents:

- Trust: If child is able to appoint parents as trustees or cotrustees.
- Advanced Directives for medical care decisions if child becomes unable to make decisions on his/her own

This program offers individuals age 18-64 receiving SSI or SSDI the opportunity to return to work full time. These individuals continue to receive benefit checks until a certain amount of money is made each month.

Medicare can also be kept for four and a half years following the termination of benefits. If the individual does not continue working full time, return to full benefits is possible. This program is an incentive for employers to hire individuals with disabilities. There is an outcome payment for employers who successfully employ individuals with disabilities.
