25% of New Mexican adults have experienced moderate to severe traumatic brain injury (TBI). 4% are fully disabled and need more services. The prevalence of TBI in every oppressed and marginalized group meets or exceeds that of the general population.

- One of four in juvenile justice.
- One of four with developmental disability.
- One of two homeless or marginally housed.
- One of two young white Veterans since 9/11
- Two of three children in foster care (and how many of their parents is unknown)
- Seven of 10 female DV survivors
- Up to 100% in the criminal justice system
- High co-occurrence with substance abuse
- High rates in every non-White racial group

Improve treatment outcomes: Make accommodations and treat for brain injury.
